

Data reporting requirements - Large org

Under EPR you need to report packaging data in more detail than was previously the case. Large producers have significant data reporting requirements going forward.

Materials used in your 'primary', 'secondary', 'transit' and 'shipment' packaging

- 1.** Primary packaging is defined as the individual container that you store goods in to sell to consumers.
- 2.** Secondary packaging is for grouping sales units together.
- 3.** Transit packaging is used to group multiple sales units together to protect them whilst being transported or handled.
- 4.** Shipment packaging is any packaging added to goods for them to be supplied through postal or courier services. It also includes packaging for click and collect items.

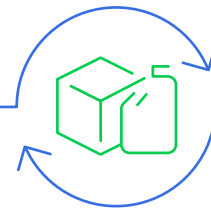

Weight of individual materials in the packaging you handle and supply

Provide all weights to the nearest kilogram and categorise your data by:

- aluminium
- glass
- paper or cardboard
- fibre-based composite
- plastic
- steel
- wood
- other*

*Report weight of materials separately, such as bio-degradable plastics, cork, cotton, flax based products, nitrile, rubber, or silicon.



Packaging likely to become household or non-household waste

You need to submit the weight of packaging that is classed as household or non-household packaging. Waste management fees will be based on the reported tonnage of 'household' packaging waste.

All primary and shipment packaging must be reported as household unless you have clear evidence the packaging is being supplied directly to a business end user or, that the packaging is used on products designed for business use & the packaging is unlikely to be disposed of in a household.

Packaging likely to end up in street bins

The government has stated that producers will be required to report how much of their household packaging matches the definition of packaging they consider likely to end up in street bins:

The government guidance states this packaging could incur higher waste management fees in accordance with the burdens on local authorities of dealing with street bin waste. (See street bin guidance)

If you supply packaged goods or empty packaging in the UK, you may need to submit 'nation data'

This data will provide information about which country in the UK your packaging has been sold/hired/loaned in.

The deadline for the reporting of 2024 'sales by nation' data is 1 December 2025.
